The Manner of Giving-Willingly

"And here is my advice about what is best for you in this matter: Last year you were the first not only to give, but also to have the desire to do so. Now finish the work, so that your eager willingness to do it may be matched by your completion of it, according to your means. For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have."

2 Corinthians 8:10-13

After church, a family was discussing the service over Sunday dinner. Dad commented on how badly the organist sounded. Mom said the choir wasn't prepared. Nancy complained the preacher was boring. Little Jack listened thoughtfully for a moment, and then he said, "It wasn't that bad of a show for a buck."

Paul was complementing the church in Corinth on their attitude toward giving, not just on the act or amount of their giving. In the previous verses, Paul said he was testing the sincerity of their love by their desire to give. Likewise, our love is tested by our willingness to offer our prayers, funds, time, and talents.

He pointed out two very important points in this passage. Giving is an important part of Christian discipleship - completion of this act is important. But equally important is the willingness and desire to do so. As with most issues in the Christian life attitudes are as important as actions.

Our attitude toward giving reveals our values and the sincerity of our love for others and God. If you need a change in attitude, ask God to fill your heart and motivate you to give in love.

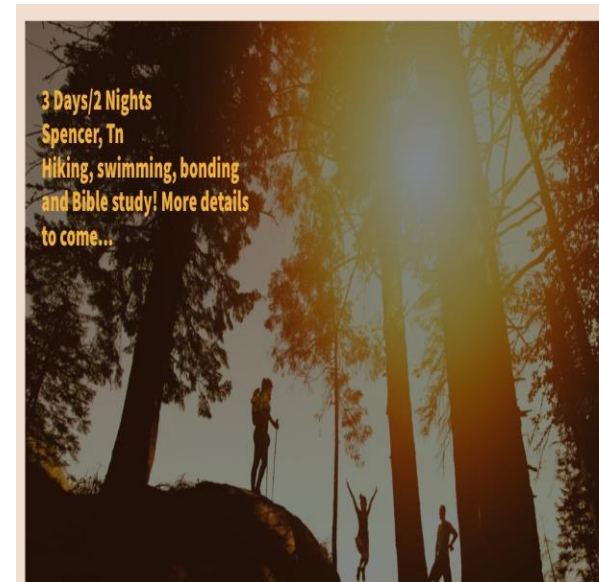

Nicaragua

Our January 2019 mission trip to Nicaragua was an eye opener on the increased poverty inflicted on the people of Nicaragua. We realized we have o change our thinking and work on how the Nicaraguan communities/families can help each other and grow together into a healthy sense of well being. We need to make our trips about hand up not hand out. We met two organizations that have a presence in Nicaragua. First is *Empower Nicaragua*. It is an organization that works with Dr. Medina to empower youth to become leaders and to instill compassion and purpose in each of their lives. It has and is very successful with the key being under guidance from the NGO where the Nicaraguans are the leaders and workers. The second is *Shining the Light Ministries*. Over the years they have created family gardens that not only supply food for themselves and their community but also enough to sell for money. The staff that runs it are Nicaraguans which includes an agronomist and vet.

The thrid program is our Mobile Medical Clinic. They saw over 8000 patients last year and this year are continuing care for six communities for acute care and chronic conditions.

We have decided to creat an alliance between these three NGO’s. Our goals are based on UN sustainability goals:

1. Good health and well-being by having access to medical and dental care.
2. Clean water and sanitation
3. Gender equality
4. End hunger
5. Quality education
6. Partnerships for the goals to come together

We will go as a team June 22 to June 29 to create a plan to work together on these goals. Our teams includes myself, Abby Smith, Joe Price, LuRae Ahrendt and Allison Floyd. Jeff Schweizer from *Shining the Light* is our leader. The two sisters Robyn and Jill out of Norcross UMC from Empower NGO will also be there.

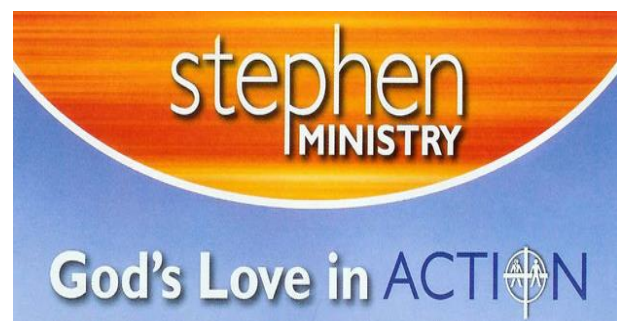
